

LETTER from the President our Board of Trustees

The Sawyer Free Library's mission is to be a place of learning, innovation, and creativity to support the community we serve. In this very challenging year, we have learned that whether our Library services are delivered in a physical location or digitally, they're not just "nice-to-haves" - our services are vital to our community. During these COVID times, our dedicated Library staff created virtual environments with responsive programming and learning opportunities for all ages. Online book clubs regularly ignited dialogue and forged connections across age groups and interests. Storytimes evolved from recorded videos to interactive experiences, allowing children and caregivers to sing and socialize with one another safely. And our Lyceum hosted acclaimed authors and engaging cultural programming for adults to learn about our community and the wider world.

The Library initiated many new and now permanent services. We strategically invested in Digital Devices

To Go, lending laptops, e-readers, tablets, and Wi-Fi hot spots to students, workers, job seekers,

and caretakers. We dramatically expanded our collection of e-books, downloadable audiobooks and
online resources in response to the increase in our residents' needs.

During the past year, the Library also advanced plans to preserve and restore the historic Saunders House with a concept design approved by the Saunders House Stewardship Committee and the Library Board. Work got underway with the conservation of the WPA Frederick L. Stoddard/Howard Curtis murals in the main stair hall. Also, the Library submitted a CPA grant for stabilization work related to brick and timber structural repairs and for restoration of the Anderson Room murals.

We owe a tremendous "thank you" to Library Director Jenny Benedict and the entire Sawyer Free Library staff for their innovative solutions during these demanding and challenging times.

CAPITAL Project

Sawyer Free Library

The project to renovate and expand the Sawyer Free Library is a once in 50-year opportunity to secure the future of our public institution. This year, the Library Board finalized the conceptual design for a renovation of the existing building and an expansion with a new modern addition toward School Street. The plan realizes our vision by respecting our history and modernizing our building for technological advancements, new methods of learning and new ways of sharing ideas and information.

The Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners determined that the updated design meets the programming requirements for the Massachusetts Public Library Construction Program provisional grant of \$9,030,047. With these milestones accomplished, the newly established Sawyer Library Foundation is moving forward with plans for fundraising and the Library Board is laying the groundwork to have this project of revitalization and reimagination shovel-ready by early 2023.

At Sawyer Free Library, we heard every day how instrumental our tools and resources were to enriching people's quality of life and supporting their path to survival. Job Seekers Online Resources

Supporting job seekers to get back to work

This year, Sawyer Free Library launched

Job Seeker Resources, a program funded

by an LSTA grant through the Massachusetts

Board of Library Commissioners. The combination

of online workshops and recommended physical

and online resources supported residents to find job opportunities and develop skills, tools and confidence in job searching.

Job seeker Maria Beck who has been out of work for over 2 years shared, "It was really after I updated my resume and changed how I was writing my cover letters with tips and suggestions from the program that I started seeing some action from potential employers. The weekly sessions gave me a sense of being back in the working world-having connections with other people and learning new tools built my confidence back up." Maria has had 5 interviews and will keep at it until she lands the right job with the right company.

Keeping kids on track for school success

Research shows that children who read at home after school, on weekends and during the summer months have greater success with grade-level reading and even improving their test scores.

Our librarians are experts in nurturing a love of reading and inspiring children to play with stories and language.



Keeping kids on track

Parent Gina Robertson says, "My children and I go to the Sawyer Free Library about once a week to browse and check out books. We deeply appreciate the knowledgeable librarians. Through COVID, we probably had 100 books out all the time. My kids love sitting with big piles of books around them. Now that they are older, they love reading about their interests. When the books about Sacajawea came in, my daughter immersed herself and got lost in that girl's world for hours on end."

Helping digital learners to navigate a digital world

Digital skills are essential for achieving success at work and in school and for people to feel included in our community. At the Sawyer Free Library, digital learning is a lifelong opportunity for everyone in our community.

This year we launched our Digital Devices to Go collection and Device Advice service. People who otherwise would not have had a connection to the Internet checked out the 13 wi-fi hotspots 263 times and the 10 Chromebooks 131 times. Each checkout provided a Gloucester household with two weeks of Internet access. One-on-one Device Advice appointments were consistently booked with people asking for assistance with accessing digital library resources and enabling device accessibility settings for visual impairments.




